The Anansi tales – or Anancy as it is sometimes spelled in Jamaica – are folktales that are still passed down as oral traditions, such as the Jamaican tale about Anansi and the Tiger's Soup. In this tale, Anansi encourages the tiger to go swimming with him and while the tiger is enjoying the swim, Anansi steals the tiger's soup.
