In the current study, we investigated two factors that can modulate the effect of bilingualism on cognitive control: cognateness on the one hand, and orthographic neighborhood on the other hand. Previous research has shown that cognates, which are defined as identical words with the same meaning in different languages [10], are processed faster by the bilingual brain than by the monolingual brain [33].

The aspect of control is linked to the bilingual effect on cognitive abilities. In one study, researchers administered a non-linguistic card-sorting task to participants that required flexibility in problem solving, inhibiting irrelevant information, as well as recognizing the constancy of certain variables in the face of changes in the rules. Bilingual children significantly outperformed their monolingual peers in this task, suggesting early development of inhibitory function that aids ...

In the first half of the 20th century, the prevailing view was that bilingualism and second-language acquisition early in life made children confused and interfered with their ability to develop normal cognitive functions¹ and succeed in educational environments.² These ideas were dramatically reversed in a landmark study by Peal and Lambert³ that showed a general superiority of bilinguals over monolinguals in a wide range of intelligence tests and aspects of school achievement.

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
