One of the most significant recommendations was that Welsh Government should establish a timetable for abolition of the 'priority need' test. Shelter Cymru has been calling for an end to priority need for many years - decades, in fact.

In November 2012, the Scottish Parliament approved theHomelessness (Abolition of Priority Need Test) (Scotland) Order 2012which was implemented from 31 December 2012. From this date, unintentionally homeless households no longer have to be assessed as priority need to be considered for settled accommodation.

The Scottish Government's abolition of the priority needs assessment when offering accommodation to PEH, entitling anyone finding themselves homelessness to settled accommodation is another example [12].
