It included among its most prominent members the Russian linguist Nikolay Trubetsky and the Russian-born American linguist Roman Jakobson; the school was most active during the 1920s and '30s.

What is now generally referred to as the Prague school comprised a fairly large group of scholars, mainly European, who, though they may not themselves have been members of the Linguistic Circle of Prague, derived their inspiration from the work of Vilém Mathesius, Nikolay Trubetsky, Roman Jakobson and other scholars based in Prague in the decade preceding World War II.

The Prague school or Prague linguistic circle is a language and literature society. It started in 1926 as a group of linguists, philologists and literary critics in Prague. Its proponents developed methods of structuralist literary analysis and a theory of the standard language and of language cultivation from 1928 to 1939. One of the founders of the Prague school N.S. Trubetzkoy (1890-1938), his follower R. Jakobson (1896-1982) defined phonemes as sets of distinctive features. With the concept of the phoneme the idea of discreteness of sound units was

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established: the phoneme as a cluster of distinctive features is discrete and invariant, but its realization may vary.

The Prague School stresses the function of elements within language, their contrast to one another, and the system formed by these elements. They developed distinctive feature analysis, by which each sound is regarded as composed of contrasting articulatory and acoustic features, with sounds perceived as different having at least one contrasting feature.

Prague functionalism is of importance both for analyzing language as a system linking expressions and meanings and for pragmatic studies of the interactive features of communication. It differs from other trends of structural linguistics by concentrating on semantic functions of language units and on pragmatic aspects of the use of language and of its varieties.
