### **Who Was Sitting Bull**

Sitting Bull (Lakota: *Thaŋháŋka Íyotake* [tʰaˈtʰɔ̃ka ˈi.jɔ̃takɛ] in Standard Lakota orthography, also nicknamed *Húnkešni* [ˈhũkɛʃni] or "Slow") was a Hunkpapa Lakota leader who led his people during years of resistance to United States government policies.

Wounded Knee. Sitting Bull (c.1831-1890) was the Native American chief under whom the Sioux tribes united in their struggle for survival on the North American Great Plains. Following the discovery of gold in the Black Hills of South Dakota in 1874, the Sioux came into increased conflict with U.S. authorities.

Sitting Bull, Indian name Tatanka Iyotake, (born c. 1831, near Grand River, Dakota Territory [now in South Dakota], U.S.—died December 15, 1890, on the Grand River in South Dakota), Teton Dakota Indian chief under whom the Sioux tribes united in their struggle for survival on the North American Great Plains. He is remembered for his lifelong distrust of white men and his stubborn determination to resist their domination.

Synopsis. Sitting Bull joined his first war party at 14 and soon gained a reputation for bravery in battle. In 1868 the Sioux accepted peace with the U.S. government, but when gold was discovered in the Black Hills in the mid-1870s, a rush of white prospectors invaded Sioux lands. Sitting Bull responded but could only win battles, not the war.

Sitting Bull. On December 15th, 1890, Lakota Indian Police were sent to Sitting Bull's cabin to apprehend him for questioning regarding an emerging Ghost Dance movement. A force of over 40 men was sent for the job. At six in the morning, Indian Police kicked in his front door and escorted him outside.
